Confirmation Handbook Spring 2019

Sacrament Registration

If you desire to receive the sacrament of confirmation in the spring of 2019, registration is taking place now. You must register by June 1, 2018, no exceptions.

Requirements

Mass Attendance

Attendance in a Roman Catholic Church for Sunday Mass and Holy days of Obligation is required by Sacred Scripture (Deut. 5:12-15) and universal church law.

Attendance recording will begin on June 3rd.

- Ave Maria requires confirmandi to submit documentation that they have attended Mass each week.
- If you are out of town, bring a bulletin from the visiting parish and turn it into to the Youth Office with the teen's name on it.
- Masstimes.org is a great resource when you are away from home to locate a church and mass near you.
- While participation in Sunday Liturgy is expected, more than 3 absences will require special permission from the pastor in order to be confirmed in the spring. You may obtain permission after having a face-to-face meeting with him.

Faith Formation Classes

ALL confirmandi must be registered by August 17th in Faith Formation classes or be a student at Ave Maria Catholic School.

- This is crucial to making sure we have enough catechists and resources to teach.
- Any and all absences in Faith Formation will need to be made up in a timely manner (within 3 weeks of the missed class).
- All seeking confirmation in the spring must be catechized to grade level.
- If your teen has not been participating in Faith Formation between 3rd-7th grade, please make an appointment with Angelle to discuss how we can help him/her prepare. Please email Angelle at aschott@avemariacatholicparish.org to set up an appointment.
- **Faith Formation classes begin September 9th @ 6:15pm in Brownstein Hall/Dwyer Hall**
- **Ave Maria School begins August 15th**

Parent Meetings

Preferably both parents but at least one parent is required to attend one 4hr session in the fall semester and one 4hr session in the spring semester

Fall Semester Options:

September 23rd 12:30- 4:30pm OR September 25th 10-2pm in Dwyer Hall

Spring Semester Options:

February 10th 12:30-4:30pm OR February 12th 10-2pm in Dwyer Hall

Goals of the parent sessions:

- Review their role as models in the faith development of their son/daughter;
- Deepen their own faith lives
- Strengthen their family relationships so all may grow in relationship with God.

Parent Responsibility

- Parents are responsible for encouraging their teen to attend preparation activities while maintaining their child's freedom to make the final choice to be confirmed.
- The choice you are asking your child to make is not whether or not to prepare but to:
 - Believe what the Church teaches
 - Want to be Confirmed in the faith
 - Practice their Catholic faith.

Such a decision can only be made after a period of thoughtful study, intentional practice and prayer.

- Parents who significantly reduce the parish's ability to effectively serve our youth or who continuously undermine the role of the church staff and pastor may be asked to delay the sacrament of Confirmation for their youth. We are aware that conflict or disagreements may arise so our expectation is our staff and our church families will speak the truth in love and respect for one another. Please do not delay in addressing your concerns. Our role is to walk with you on this journey and provide pastoral care when it is most needed.

Confirmation Retreat

All confirmandi are required to attend 1 retreat. Confirmation retreats begin Friday at 7pm and end Sunday at 11:30am. Attendance is required for the entire duration of the retreat. The dates are as follows:

November 9-11th

Jan 25-27th

Saint Report

Confirmandi are asked to research and choose a saint they want to emulate. Specific details will be provided at a later time. The google form can be found on the avemariacatholicparish.org website under Confirmation.

- **Saint reports are due November 1st or earlier**

Sponsors

Candidates must choose a suitable sponsor who will accompany them and meet the following requirements:

- Have been chosen by the candidate personally and have a significant relationship with the candidate
- Have attained the age of sixteen (16) unless special circumstances are approved by clergy
- Be a fully initiated, confirmed, practicing Catholic that participates in Sunday liturgy weekly, leads a life of strong moral character and faith and is not bound by any canonical penalty
- Is not the mother or father of the candidate
*****Canon law states that it is preferable that the Confirmation sponsor be the baptismal sponsor so the link between Baptism and Confirmation is clearly defined**

Sponsor Form – to be completed by the sponsor and signed by the sponsor's parish.

***If the sponsor is a parishioner at Ave Maria, please have sponsor read and sign their portion and return to the youth office for parish signature.

Sponsor/Confirmandi Meeting Dates

Sponsors will attend with confirmandi on the following 2 dates, if the sponsor is out of town or cannot make these dates; a parent may take the place and provide materials to the sponsor.

November 4th 6:30-7:30pm in the Church

April 14th 6:30-7:30pm in the Church

These meetings will take place in the church. Please be mindful of the sacred space and maintain reverence by taking conversations in the gathering space, no drinks, snacks, gum, or hats.

Priest Interview

Fr. Gus would like the clergy to meet with each confirmandi to determine readiness for the sacrament of Confirmation. These will be scheduled through the Youth office and completed in the spring (generally March/April timeframe). Please make yourself available for the scheduled blocks of time.

Confirmation Date

The sacrament of Confirmation is reserved for the Bishop and the dates will be announced at the beginning of 2019. Families will be invited to sign up for a date once all paperwork is completed and turned in.
